Bishop Kulick to lead Diocesan St. Joseph pilgrimage

Bishop Larry J. Kulick will lead a pilgrimage to the four St. Joseph parishes across the Diocese of Greensburg, and at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, as he dedicates the Diocese to the patronage of St. Joseph on March 18 and 19. Bishop Kulick's dedication is for the Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission in 2024, the Jubilee Year of 2025 and the 75th anniversary of the Diocese of Greensburg in 2026.

Patron of the universal Church, families, workers, immigrants and a happy death, St. Joseph nurtured the child Jesus in the first Eucharistic Adoration chapel in his home in Nazareth, responded with faith each time he was called by God and is a model to us of faithful discipleship as we live our mission as Eucharistic people.

Each site along the pilgrimage will focus on a different aspect of Joseph as a faithful disciple, helping us to strengthen and rededicate our own relationship with Jesus Christ. The faithful are encouraged to participate in the pilgrimage, which will include the following:

Top Student program extended to higher education at Franciscan University

Because of the continued generosity of an anonymous donor, Catholic high school students in the Diocese of Greensburg, or those attending Catholic high schools in Western Pennsylvania, could receive priority for tuition assistance, regardless of income, if they choose to attend Franciscan University of Steubenville. This new initiative is funded by the same anonymous donor who funded the TOP Student program in the Diocese of Greensburg. To date, the TOP Student program has provided tuition assistance to 800 families in Catholic schools across the four counties of the Diocese and has helped to increase enrollment in Diocesan Catholic schools by 20% in just two years; that is one of the largest Catholic school enrollment increases in North America.
